CARTERSVILLE, GEORGIA QUARTERBACK TREVOR LAWRENCE NAMED THE 2018 U.S. ARMY PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Lawrence honored with high school football's most prestigious individual award

SAN ANTONIO (Jan. 5, 2018) – U.S. Army All-American quarterback Trevor Lawrence (Cartersville High School/Cartersville, GA) is the 2018 U.S. Army Player of the Year. The award is given annually to the nation's most outstanding high school senior football player, and is the most prestigious individual award given in high school football.

Trevor Lawrence, a Clemson commit and the #1 overall prospect in the class of 2018, has demonstrated time and time again, why he is the player of the year. Standing at 6'6" and 208 pounds, Lawrence uses his height to his advantage to throw the ball down the field with such precision, accuracy and strength, it causes jaw dropping and eye popping reactions each time he drops back to pass. This season, Trevor completed 69% of his passes, converting it into 3,290 passing yards and 41 passing touchdowns.

The selection process began this fall as players were evaluated by the U.S. Army All-American Bowl Selection Committee—consisting of All American Games and its official selection partner, 247Sports—and by coaches from across the country. Past U.S. Army Player of the Year Award winners include Kevin Jones (2001), Lorenzo Booker (2002), Adrian Peterson (2004), Jimmy Clausen (2007), Terrelle Pryor (2008), Dorial Green-Beckham (2012), Elijah Hood (2014), Martez Ivey (2015), and Jacob Eason (2016).

For 18 years, the U.S. Army All-American Bowl has been the nation's premier high school all-star event and football game, serving as the preeminent launching pad for America's future college and NFL stars. Odell Beckham Jr., Andrew Luck, Eric Berry, Tim Tebow, and Sam Darnold are just some who made their national debuts as U.S. Army All-Americans. A total of 351 U.S. Army All-American alumni have been selected in NFL Drafts. Last year's Bowl drew an all-time record crowd of 40,568 to the Alamodome.
